INTRODUCTION ABOUT SVC

Dear Families,

The upcoming School Vacation Care program will commence on Monday the 3rd of July 2023 and end on Friday the 14th of July 2023.

This Document outlines the educational, cultural and social outcomes of our planned activities as prescribed by the National Quality Framework (NQF) and the My Time Our Place Framework (MTOP).

The Program for each day included supporting activities that will operate in conjunction with the main programmed events or activities described in this overview. These include, but are not limited to:

- Construction activities with a wide range of versatility
- Dramatic play and interaction
- Music and Dance
- Art and Craft activities
- Sporting activities
- Quiet reading/relaxation and sleep rest areas
- Board Games
- Science activities
- A range of other social interaction-based activities designed to keep children entertained, active and productively engaged

The activities and excursions include responses to parent's and children's feedback and ideas, which we strive to incorporate as much as possible into our program. We gathered information from children's ideas during the After School Care (ASC) Program during Term 1 and 2 2023 as well as throughout the 2022/23 School Vacation Care (SVC) Programs. This information was collated and analysed by the Afters team to achieve the most rounded SVC Program possible in relation to the NQF and MTOP standards.

Aranda Afters Association Inc. engages in a variety of excursions and trips away from the Centre as part of our School Vacation Care program and as such, we will be using CDC Canberra Transportation previously known as Qcity Charter Transportation for all our travel needs. As part of excursion and incursion regulations for supervision, Aranda Afters' School Vacation Care must comply with legal ratios which dictate how many staff we must have rostered on to work per number of children. This ratio is:

Excursions = 1 Staff : 8 Children

Incursions / While at the Centre = 1 Staff : 11 Children

Water Based Excursions = 1 Staff : 5 Children

WEEK 1 WINTER SVC

Monday 3rd of July 2023- Excursion: National Museum: Program Animal Tracks

Starting the Winter School Holiday Program off we will be attending an Excursion to the National Museum. This Excursion will take place in the morning session of the day. An organised program Animal Tracks will be facilitated by Museum staff. Children will learn about the native Australian Animals. This excursion will run two sessions with groups taking turns while also being able to tour the Museum. Please arrive at the service by 10am for this excursion.

For the afternoon session we will be having a picnic lunch near the lake before heading back to the service. We will be watching a documentary by National Geographic about Australian Wild Animal to continue with the theme of the day.

Tuesday 4th of July 2023- Incursion: Toonworld Modelling Workshop + Indigenous Story Telling Activities.

For the second day of the School Holiday Program we will be starting the day off with a Modelling Clay Workshop by Toonworld. This will be separated into x2 1.5 hour workshops catered to age level.

For the second half of the day we will be focusing the day into having some focus around Naidoc Week. We will be starting the afternoon off with a Native Nature Bushwalk while collecting natural materials from native plants to then use for some artwork. We will also have other indigenous activities as well as story reading by indigenous authors and craft.

Incursion with Toonworld starts at 10am

Bushwalk will start at 1:30pm

Wednesday 5th of July 2023 - Split Excursion Day: iPlay Juniors and VR Canberra Seniors

For our 3rd day of the Winter Holidays we have our very first split excursion day catered to the ages of the children. In the Morning session the juniors will head to their excursion to iplay for a 90 min session. While the seniors will stay back and participate in some indigenous cooking activities such as damper and orange and wattleseed muffins. For the afternoon session the seniors will attend their excursion to VR Canberra in Mitchell to enjoy some virtual reality games/experience. While the seniors are at the excursion the juniors will stay back and participate in some indigenous arts and crafts activities.

Junior Excursion: Preschool, Kindergarten, Year 1, Year 2. Excursion to iplay: Please be at the service by 10am to allow time prepare for the excursion. Departing service at 10:30am. Arriving back at 1pm.

Senior Excursion: Year 3, Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6. Excursion to VR Canberra in Mitchell. Please arrive at the service by 12pm to allow time to prepare for the excursion. Departing service at 12:30pm. Arriving back at 3:30pm



WEEK 1 WINTER SVC

Thursday 6th of July 2023- Incursion: Indigenous Sports Games + Footsteps

For our 4th day of the School Holiday Program we will be starting the day off with acknowledging Naidoc week by learning about some indigenous sport games. For this we will be heading over to the Aranda District playing fields oval. Children will also be able to participate in some mindfulness colouring in and quite games while down at the oval. If it is due to rain we will continue with the plan although move everything to the basketball court and Hall of the service areas.

For the afternoon session we will be starting our incursion with Footsteps. Children will participate in an 1 hour workshop with a Footsteps Instructor.

Incursion with Footsteps will begin at 2pm

Friday 7th of July 2023- Excursion: National Arboretum Canberra

For our final day of the first week of the Winter School Holiday Program we will be ending the week off with an Excursion to the Arboretum. Finishing Naidoc Week off Children will be participating in a program: My Country, Your Country. During this program children will be introduced to the Bush Tucker Garden and use of the native plants and tress. Children will also learn through stories, learn about ceremonial artefacts and understand the significant of the land. Following the excursion we will have a picnic lunch at the Pod Playground before heading back to the service. (The lunch will not be provided by afters.)

For the afternoon session we will be heading back to the service for a movie afternoon session. Children will be able to watch the new Blinky Bill: The Movie while enjoying some popcorn and quite activities.

For our 8th day of the Holidays we will be starting the day off to a highly requested excursion to Flipout. Children will enjoy 2 hours of jump time as well as participating in other equipment available at the venue such as a climbing wall. The venue will also provide grip socks for all children.

For the afternoon session we are having a messy Arts and Craft and STEM session. Activities including, Slime making, Cloud Dough, Shaving Cream Rain Clouds, Marble Painting and a Building competition.

MY TIME OUR PLACE ACHIEVEMENTS

School age care settings pay attention to the needs and interests of individual children within a context that promotes collaboration and active citizenship. Children in school age care settings have choice and control over their learning as they collaborate with educators to extend their life skills and develop dispositions towards citizenship.

Children's wellbeing, development and enrichment is achieved in different and equally meaningful ways. Their development is not always predictable and linear. Our educators plan and collaborate with children and with the following Outcomes in mind.

The following Outcomes demonstrate how the three elements of the MTOP Framework combine to guide program decision-making and assessment to promote children's opportunities for belonging, being and becoming.

Outcome 1: Children and young people have a strong sense of identity

- 1.Children and young people feel safe, secure and supported.
- 2.Children and young people develop autonomy, inter-dependence, resilience and sense of agency.
- 3.Children and young people develop knowledgeable and confident self-identities and a positive sense of self-worth.
- 4.Children and young people learn to interact in relation to others with care, empathy and respect.

Outcome 2: Children and young people are connected with and contribute to their world

- 1.Children and young people develop a sense of belonging to groups and communities and an understanding of their reciprocal rights and responsibilities necessary as active and informed citizens.
- 2.Children and young people respond to diversity with respect.
- 3.Children and young people become aware of fairness.
- 4.Children and young people become socially responsible and show respect for the environment.

Outcome 3: Children and young people have a strong sense of wellbeing

- 1.Children and young people become strong in their social, emotional and mental wellbeing.
- 2.Children and young people become strong in their physical learning and wellbeing.
- 3.Children and young people are aware of and develop strategies to support their own mental and physical health, and personal safety.

Outcome 4: Children and young people are confident and involved learners

- 1.Children and young people develop a growth mindset and learning dispositions such as curiosity, cooperation, confidence, creativity, commitment, enthusiasm, persistence, imagination and reflexivity.
- 2.Children and young people develop a range of learning and thinking skills and processes such as problem solving, inquiry experimentation, hypothesising, researching and investigating.
- 3.Children and young people transfer and adapt what they have learnt from one context to another.
- 4.Children and young people resource their own learning through connecting with people, place, technologies and natural and processed materials.

Outcome 5: Children and young people are effective communicators

- 1.Children and young people Interact verbally and non-verbally with others for a range of purposes.
- 2.Children and young people engage with and gain meaning from a range of visual images and texts.
- 3.Children and young people collaborate with others, express ideas and make meaning using a range of digital technologies and media and communication technologies.

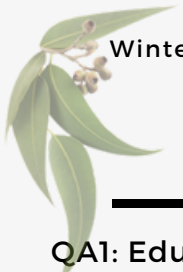

NATIONAL QUALITY STANDARDS

QA1: Educational Program and Practice:

This SVC Children will be able to participate in a program that caters around the Winter Season and learn to acknowledge and show awareness during Naidoc Week during the first week of this Holidays. Children will be able to participate in a range of different activities that cater to all learning abilities. This SVC program a different theme is developed for children to engage in a range of activities that relate to the theme as well as still have the ability to have free play and enjoy the program and choose what they would like to do. This SVC we are incorporating the new MTOP Place outcomes into the program as we transition into the updated version of the MTOP Framework.

QA2: Children's Health and Safety:

- Children will have available a range of outdoors and indoors activities that promote their health and wellbeing while at the service.
- Children will have an available a range of different healthy afternoon tea meals available to them each day.
- Children will have a sleep and rest area available to them at all hours throughout the day.

QA3: Physical Environment:

- Staff will perform a Work health and safety check on arrival every morning.
- Risk assessments are written up to minimize risks during Excursions and Incursions.
- All equipment used during the day of the service will be cleaned and sanitized as much as possible every day.

QA4 Staffing Arrangements:

- Staff will be required to engage the children in the program as much as possible but also allow children to express their own interests.
- Staff will be required to follow ratio requirements while at the service and on excursion to ensure the best supervision.
- Rosters will be done accordingly to meet ratio requirements and constant upkeep with changes to roster.
- Staff are required to show professionalism at all times during the day while on excursions and while the service.

QA5 Relationships with Children:

- Respectful Relationships are maintained with each child.
- Staff will be required to build trusting relationships with children and support and engage children at the service.
- Each child will be able to express their own opinions and will take charge of their wellbeing and needs during the program.

QA6 Collaborative partnerships with families and communities:

- Families will be asked to provide feedback on the program/service.
- Children will visit Canberra's local areas during excursions.

QA7 Governance and Leadership:

- Leadership will be available at all times of the day for effective leadership for staff and children during the day.
- At least 2 Supervisor on Excursions and Incursions and a First Aid Officer on floor at all times.
- Evaluations to take place daily to support further days and future SVC planning.
